## *From the Minister*

---

I was raised by two women. I lived with my mother, who raised me intellectually. But it was with my God mother that my heart melted. She raised me emotionally and spiritually. As an adult, I returned yearly to California to spend a few days with each one of them. In recent years they both suffered memory loss and lived in care facilities.

On September 17<sup>th</sup> I was notified that both were dying. As it turned out, my God mother died that day and my mother lived on in a confused state of mind. I returned for the funeral of my God mother. The service was loving and allowed me the tears I needed to share. The next day, however, was bitter. My mother was in a delusional and sometimes agitated state. Medications could calm her for awhile – but then the angst would return.

I recalled then the story of Jacob wrestling all night with an angel. The angel is going to win, but Jacob resists with all of his might. As the sun rises, the angel touches Jacob's hip and he collapses. Then the angel blesses him. This occurs next to a river. One interpretation (for me) is that the river is the passing over of death. We all lose this battle – but in the losing we are blessed with either eternal peace or a new adventure for our soul.

I was grateful to return home – to my family, friend, and to our beloved community at the Unitarian Church of Sharon. We cherish our loved ones who have died by living the very best lives that we can. A few hours ago I learned that now my mother has also died. These two souls live on in me and in a Greater Love.

This year, our Grades 1-2-3 class will be making friends with first graders in Uganda. Thanks to our Board of Trustees and the work of our minister, Jim Robinson, the Unitarian Church of Sharon has gotten in on the ground floor of an exciting new project in which churches in England and the USA are partnering with the New Life School, in the Masaka district of Uganda. Part of this partnership includes the opportunity to make friends with a classroom of children at New Life School.

Our first-, second-, and third-graders have started by making a banner about themselves to greet new friends and introduce themselves to the first graders at New Life School. Because of limited access to electricity in the Masaka district, communication will begin by snail mail. There are plans afoot at the school to work toward more 21st century forms of communication, but we're starting with what is currently available.

The 1-2-3 class will alternate between the curriculum Love Will Guide Us and occasional lessons about our new friends. Please check in with members of the 1-2-3 class to learn more about this exciting new experience.

## *The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee*

We are starting this year's theatre season with the very cute *25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee* at MMAS on Saturday, Nov. 5. It is a one act musical comedy conceived by Rebecca Feldman with music and lyrics by William Finn, a book by Rachel Sheinkin and additional material by Jay Reiss. The show centers around a fictional spelling bee set in a geographically ambiguous Putnam Valley Middle School. Six quirky adolescents compete in the Bee, run by three equally-quirky grown-ups.

### *Videotaping our services?*

You may remember last spring that we were videotaping the service with Matt Meyer. You may have wondered why. Basically we were doing to see what we could use that video for and what we would have to consider when editing it and we thought that having a taped service in-hand would spur our thinking.

We wondered if we would be able to show it on cable or show our services live (or slightly delayed if Rory sings any of his original songs) on the internet. Would it suffice to just have a copy available in the library for anyone to use like the audio recordings of the services which are there now?

We wondered how much editing we should do. Should we go as far as correct the color? Were we right to not record Joys and Concerns? That particular service had a delightful presentation by the Children's Choir: do we show that? Do we show it but blur out the image so you can't really see which children are there? Do we want to show the words to hymns while they are being sung? Is it worth spending an hour or two on editing and an equal time printing and distributing something we don't know how many people will want to see? Will speakers feel they have to let themselves be taped when they really don't want to be?

Other questions would concern how much we wanted to spend on a camera, what kind of camera and where to locate it since most everywhere we might place it seems to be in the way. How do we handle the sound? Do we want to use two cameras? Who will operate it or them? Do we send a live feed into the nursery or another room?

There are a lot of questions so far and I'm sure there are more. What do you think about these issues and this project in general? ## Social Justice Update - October 2011

**Association Sunday** – On October 9<sup>th</sup>, UCS will celebrate Association Sunday and the “brown envelope” offerings collected that Sunday will go towards this annual fundraising campaign. This campaign of the Unitarian Universalist Association is to promote growth and to reaffirm our connections as an association of congregations. Excellence in Ministry is the theme for 2011. Funds collected this year will be used to support UU ministries in a variety of ways, including providing scholarships and continuing education grants for UU religious professionals and conducting a comprehensive assessment of UU ministries. The “**brown envelope**” offerings for the other four Sundays in October will support the Vermont Disaster Relief Fund. This fund was created in response to the statewide devastation caused by Tropical Storm Irene. The fund was created by the United Ways of Vermont in cooperation with the executive board of the Vermont Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster (Vermont VOAD) and Vermont Emergency Management (VEM) to be used specifically for long-term recovery. The fund will be used entirely for the unmet long-term needs of survivors of the Irene disaster, and decisions will be made by Long Term Recovery Committees recognized by VOAD and VEM.
