SOCIAL JUSTICE UPDATES - JULY 2016

The "brown envelope" offerings for the months of July and August will support the summer youth programs of the **UU Urban Ministry**. UU Urban Ministry will send at least 25

at-risk children to one of three renowned specialty arts camps in Hingham, Dover and Brookline for five weeks this summer through discounted tuition rates and donations. UU Urban Ministry is also partnering with the Boston Youth Fund to provide "earn and learn" summer jobs in which 12 to 15 teens will earn a paycheck for working on community issues in the Roxbury neighborhood.

On Sunday, July 17th, we will have a representative from UUUM speak about the services they are providing during the morning worship service. Please plan to attend, and if you are unable to attend see <u>www.uuum.org</u> for more information.

Thank you! The Social Justice Committee is grateful to report that from July 2015 through June 19, 2016 a total of \$12,799 was donated through the "Brown Envelope" offerings received and supplemented with Fair Trade sales profits. In May, \$1,033 was donated to the Louis D. Brown Peace Institute. From the donations in the first three Sundays in June, \$725 was donated to GLSEN (Gay Lesbian Straight Education Network). Thank you for your generosity!

People Over Pipelines March – 350 Mass and Mass Power Forward are organizing a 43-mile, five day march against new gas pipelines in Massachusetts. From July 14th to 18th, volunteers will walk along the route of Spectra's proposed Access Northeast pipeline, will pass by the proposed compressor station in Weymouth, stand with allies in West Roxbury to stop the pipeline construction, and then march to the State House to deliver our message to legislators. On Thursday, July 14th, UCS will host the marchers overnight at our church. This will be the first day of the march and one of the longest (16 miles). We know that the marchers will be thirsty, hungry and tired after their trek from Medway through Walpole to Sharon. We request volunteers to welcome the marchers that evening and to bring a pot luck dish to serve about 50 people. We will need the dishes delivered to the church around 6:00 PM.
