Nov. 6 The Syrian Crisis

(Please note that Daylight Savings Time ends on November 6th.)



This service will take the sadness, horror, and anger we may feel about Aleppo, the Syrian Civil War, and the millions of displaced refugees and turn it into concrete action. The service will be led by two members of the Syrian-American Medical Association, Dr. Abdulfatah Elshaar and his daughter Ala'a Elshaar, who have worked in the refugee camps in the Middle East. Nov. 13 Nurturing Healthy Relationships

Healthy relationships do not happen by magic. There are basic guidelines which nurture relationships. We will explore some of those guidelines and encourage you to think about how you would apply them in your life. We will give a special focus to family relationships. We will also apply these guidelines to the distrust between political groups in our country.

Nov. 20 Thanksgiving

Gratitude is one of the most important and effective spiritual practices. Without an active practice of gratitude, our life is pulled down into a morass of worry and negativity. But when gratitude stays at the center of our life, then we experience joy for the gift of life and the suffering we must encounter can be transformed into compassion.

Nov 27 Breath: The Intimacy of Inspiration

As tradition has it, the first meditation practice the Buddha taught (after his awakening) was to simply experience yourself breathing. In the Jewish book of Genesis, God breathes into the human form to give it life. Modern science describes the human breath with amazing complexity. This service will explore the human breath and how the Divine is as close to us as our breathing.

November in Religious Education

November will find our RE classes busy preparing for our annual Revels celebration on Dec 11th.

Preschool-Kindergarten will focus on the story of the baby born in the stable. The children will explore different aspects of this story while enjoying walks outside, trying movement exercises, and creating animals to fill their very own barn.

The **Grade 1-2** students will learn about the solstice and the sun as a source of life within us. They will also learn about monoliths and undertake a large art project to share their explorations with the congregation at Revels.

The **Grade 3-4** group will be exploring the traditions of Hanukkah and Yule. The students will learn about the lighting of the menorah, deck the halls of their classroom, and prepare to lead our Revels call to worship. An important focus during these explorations will be the question "What does it mean to lead worship?"

The **Grade 5-6** class will be exploring the Italian folktale "La Befana." They will be storyboarding and creating puppets to share their own version of this story with us at Revels.

The **Grade 7-8** students who are participating in the OWL program will have one more Sunday morning session in November. (Their OWL sessions will then move to Sunday afternoons – please see dates and times listed in this newsletter.) The class will begin Revels prep on November 13th and will be exploring the symbolism and traditions of Santa Lucia.

Comprehensive Sexuality Education for Grades 5-6

Parents of 5th and 6th graders are invited to find out what *Our Whole Lives for Grades 5-6 (OWL 5-6)* is all about at a one-hour informational meeting on Sunday, November 13, at noon. We'll watch a video about maintaining healthy communication between parent and adolescent, with a brief discussion to follow. You'll learn about the structure of the OWL 5-6 program (including parents' roles), review the topics and themes, and find out when the church will offer this program – so that you can make an informed decision about your child's participation in *OWL*. "Fun care" and healthy snacks will be available to your children during this program.

Please also save the date for the kick-off of OWL 5-6: Sunday, January 8, 12:30 to 3 pm. Participation in this January meeting by your $5^{\text{th}}/6^{\text{th}}$ grader and at least one parent are required for your child to take part in the rest of *OWL 5-6*.

Conversations at the Meetinghouse - Friday, November 4, 7pm

Our presenter will be Stuart Sears, PhD speaking on "The Middle East and the Refugee Crisis". Stuart Sears is an Arabic Language and cultural scholar who received his PhD from the University of Chicago in Arabic and Islamic Studies. He is co-founder of the Arabic Language Associate and formerly Professor at the American School in Cairo, Egypt. Professor Sears will describe the current situation in the Middle East and its relation to the refugee crisis.

SOCIAL JUSTICE UPDATES - NOVEMBER 2016

Social Justice Sunday – November 6: Representatives from the Syrian American Medical Society (www.samsusa.net) will be the guest speakers at both worship services. SAMS is a non-profit, non-political, educational and humanitarian organization. Its members are medical professionals of Syrian descent. The services will include special music played by Syrian American musicians.

Brown Envelope Update: We raised \$795 over three Sundays in September to support our Partner Church in Gyulakuta, Romania. We'll pay for the second semester high school tuition of one of the church members (\$300) and send the rest via the UU Partner Church Council to support the congregation. October brown envelope offerings will support the New Start Project.

Our November brown envelope offerings will support the work of the Syrian American Medical Society.

Shopping For Justice – You can buy **Shopping for Justice** cards at church during coffee hour or order extra cards in advance. We have cards in various denominations for Shaws, Stop & Shop, and Big Y (which recently bought out the Hannaford stores in our area), and +/-5% of the value stays with the church to help fund our social justice projects in support of people who experience food and housing insecurity locally and beyond.

Everyone is welcome to attend our monthly meetings, where we plan and coordinate the social justice activities of the church and discuss current issues.
