"The language of white supremacy will make some white folks uncomfortable, but it is important to call these systems what they are. The language is not intentionally divisive: it is an honest truth about this society. Invite people into transformation, invite them to not close down their hearts to the pain and grief of Black and Brown people, invite them to do their own work as white people. It is our responsibility as white folks to not look away in discomfort or look down in shame. For at the heart, this is about Black and Brown people being killed by the state and about their lives not mattering in society. It's about that pain of yet another Black child who was killed this week by police. This is about generations of trauma and violence. Let us choose courage over complicity and comfort."

How To Be Your Own Light in the Age of Trump
